The Real Work of God

... Don't be weary in well doing: for in due season you will reap, if you faint not (Galatians 6:9).

Thile the world of "Christian Service" goes on with its endless activities of "ministry for the Lord," God is quietly, steadily and faithfully at work in your life.

As impressive as all of the religious activities may appear to be, it is often little more than religious fluff. True ministry is intensely personal, borne out of self-sacrifice for another. It is freely being spent (used up) in the situation of life where Father has placed us, and regardless of how you may "see" things or "feel" about the value of your personal sacrifice, it is in the silent, unrecognized giving of yourself and your daily life in the seemingly routine details of the day that you are used in **His** real ministry. It is in your regular avenue of living that your role as a "Son of God"!

I am not talking here about an occasional "act of service," but of your daily LIVING SACRIFICE for Him in every detail and circumstance of life, being His available vessel – His channel of care and love – in EVERY SINGLE SITUATION, EVERY SINGLE DAY, day in and day out.

Your life is what true ministry is all about. It is not something that you "go and do." It is who you are as our Father lives His life in and through you. Your daily sacrifice is what true ministry is all about. To give your life as a living sacrifice to God is to experience tremendous hardship, care, burden, heartache, difficulty, trial and inconvenience.

Anyone can participate in a religious activity (so-called "Christian service") for an hour or two here and there and go home and relax; but true ministry is about LIFE, it is sacrificially lived in real life – in our homes, at work, at play, anywhere we are – every day.

Sacrificial living is about your Father doing His work in you. It is not about recognition, display, grandeur or applause. It is about responsibility, devotedness and faithfulness "in a few things" and with those who have the appearance of being "least of these." There are many places of pretense of ministry; but your daily life is EXACTLY where Dad is doing His work – in those circumstances and activities that might appear to you to be just the daily duties of routine.

Many Christians are busy with their convenient "churches," "ministries," "fellowships," "Bible studies" and "serving the Lord." Sadly, though, things are NOT what they always appear to be. The life of our Father is about real life – everyday life –

Strictly Personal

Greetings, precious saints!

I have not written a personal note to you in quite some time. Things just have been very busy around here this winter. When I wasn't working, or shoveling snow, I tried to take advantage of the quiet season to finish up a number of heart-pressed book projects.

Some have reported that they have missed my personal words in the *BSN*. Hopefully you will see from me more often in this way.

"How Can I Help?"

From time to time I hear from some of you asking how you could help in the work in which we are engaged. This is a natural and godly desire; as it is the work of God's spirit making us channels of His resources. It is what Paul referred to as "the fellowship of the gospel" when he wrote to the Philippians (1:5), rejoicing that they had so faithfully partnered with him in sharing in the labors of the gospel.

For a long time I have thought that it may be most beneficial to you if I outlined some of the means by which you could join us in "the fellowship of the gospel."

First of all, I would like to thank each of you who already graciously give your support both prayerfully and financially. I am not sure where this work that God has given me would be if it were not for your ministry in this way with me. Without your fellowship this weekly periodical, the *Daily Email Goodies* and the hundreds of articles, booklets and books that we have in print would not even exist.

How We Make Our Living

Before I talk about ways that you can help, maybe it would be helpful for you to understand how we make a living. I work for a living – just like you. I do this by conviction, as I believe that Paul provided an example of "tent making" as he proclaimed the gospel.

Our family actually attempts to make our living by selling used books online. We sell all kinds: history books, cookbooks, sports books, hobby books, etc. We do so

as *ParlorBooks.com*. We currently have about 35,000 titles online. Most of our sales come though the utilization of major online marketplaces such as Amazon, ABE, Alibris, Half.com and Ebay.

We have basically made our living this way since leaving the ministry in 1995. It has always been a challenging and somewhat meager way to make a living, usually producing just enough to allow us to supply our needs, so that we may devote as much time as possible to what is really on my heart – the ministry of the Word.

We do not make a living through any of our ministry areas. The sale of Bible study literature through *StudyShelf.com* — books that I have written, the subscriptions to the *BSN*, etc. — are simply attempts to help cover their costs and sustain their existence. In fact, these efforts are mainly subsidized by the personal efforts and financial support of our family and a few others who give of themselves for this work.

To help keep overhead down, and to be the most efficient at what we do, in 2004 we moved to Windber, PA, to bring our family, business and ministry functions all "under one roof."

We purchased a former funeral home at a greatly reduced price. After all, who wants to buy an old mortuary, right? The main facility was originally built in 1895, and became a funeral home in 1932. When we first came to look at the property there were still caskets here, and the embalming room was still intact.

We live and work where some would cringe to work; but death is a natural part of life – and we now bring much life and laughter, where for decades there had been so much death and crying.

This facility that Father has provided affords us the room to live, work and house our books and offices, all in one location. We have our offices in the former funeral home office, and in some of the former "viewing areas." We have our books on 200 bookcases set up chiefly in the former chapel and main viewing room. We store our yet-to-be-processed used books in the former hearse garage bays. We make use of other unique features too, such as the casket lift, which more easily allowed us to move our nine 26' truck loads of books, and office and household belongings into their new home.

Come Visit Us

By the way, if you are ever in the area we would love to have you come and visit – we would enjoy your fellowship.

Schedule permitting you can even spend the night with us. There is nothing fancy here, but we do have the best "Dead and Breakfast" in town!

Ways You Can Help

Needless to say, being such a small, shoestring undertaking, we sincerely welcome your *fellowship in the gospel*.

• **Pray for me**, and those who labor with me, as Father would give you the heart to do so. This is no small matter! The adversary is opposed to the message that we share. If the *Daily Email Goodies* is a daily reminder to do so, or the BSN is a weekly reminder, I would be thankful.

Finally, brothers, **pray for us,** that the Word of the Lord may have free course, and be glorified, even as it is with you (II Thessalonians 3:1).

• **Give financially.** This is no small matter either! Every aspect of our ministry involves money – every day, every week. This is a self-paying ministry as we must support ourselves, our family and our work of ministry. We have no organization to foot the bills. Your "communication" (i.e, sharing, distribution) with me is much appreciated.

Now you Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but you only (Philippians 4:15).

If you value our work and teaching, you are invited to join us in supporting and advancing it. Even the smallest amount is helpful, either in paying for a ream of paper to print study literature, or freeing up even an hour of my time for study or writing.

Many might have a heart to give, but do not do so because they believe that their own gifts would seem meager. They might feel that what they are able to give seems so insignificant. One-time gifts are such a cause

of thanksgiving to the Father, but frankly very small regular gifts could be used here in an essential way, to make a big difference. We include a link on our website where you have the opportunity to give.

- Internet opportunities. If you participate in social networking on the internet, post links to our articles and books. This will expose others to the material that we have available as well as assist us in internet search engine rankings.
- **Send us books.** We are actively republishing old Bible study works. We currently have over 100 such works in book or booklet form.

Do you have old Bible study material that was a blessing to you? Why not join with us in making this material available to others. In fact, if it is old and rare, it is possible that it could actually be lost "forever." Why not consider scanning it, or sending it to us for someone else to scan?

• **Scanning.** Speaking of scanning, do you have a scanner? We already have a number of book projects that are waiting to be scanned. Would you be willing to scan a book for us to publish? Send for a list of titles from which to choose.

One large project that we have is a parallel Bible. This work will contain 6 rare, now public domain translations that deal more accurately with "eternity," "everlasting" and punishment passages. This is a monumental undertaking and we need a lot of scanners and proofreaders.

• Financing a book set-up. Could you finance the setup of a book? We use on-demand printing for all of the books that we publish. This is a great technology. Without it we would not have this vast re-printing ministry.

We use two on-demand printing companies. With the initial company that we use to start all of our projects, there are no set-up fees; but as we have the finances, we move titles to a second printing company, which cuts our cost per book by about half. We have dozens of books waiting to be set-up at the less expensive printing company. It costs us about \$100 per title to do so.

- Your skills. Inform us of your skills and what you are willing and able to do. We are always in need of all kinds of skills around here. If we know what you are willing and able to do, you could probably be of help (e.g. photographers, graphic artists, web designers, marketers, proof readers, painters, plumbers, etc.).
- **Translation.** If you are proficient in another language you could translate some of our material for us. Via the internet, the "world" is "listening" you could help us "speak" to them!
- **Equipment.** Our equipment is older, as we have always picked up our equipment secondhand. Maybe you have something that you aren't using that we could make good use of here, or know of someone who does.

We are always in need of computers, scanners, printers, copiers and other office equipment.

For our in-house printing projects (BSN, booklets, leaflets, etc.) we could use a color printer, paper cutter, and paper folder. (For example, we currently fold all of our work by hand).

One of our most frequent requests are audio and video recordings. For these teachings we would need audio recording and editing equipment, as well as video recording and editing equipment, with accessories.

• **Two daughters-in-law.** This is a *VERY* serious request. I need two daughters-in-law. I have four adult children, two are married. My two sons who faithfully work with me in our family business and labor side-by-side with me in our family ministry both need wives.

And the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone" (Genesis 2:18).

Many young women of our day are preoccupied with pursuing a career; thoughts of marriage, family-life and having children appear to be far from their minds.

Are you available? Or, do you know two young ladies who are looking to marry and have a family? If so, speak up! Again, this is a very serious matter.

My oldest, Clyde III (29), and my youngest Nathan (23), are *the* most wonderful men that I know. They love the Lord, they love the truth of His Word, they value family life, and are dedicated to a lifestyle that keeps the family together working in a family business. They are looking for young ladies who are ready to settle down and join them in our family business and ministry. I can hardly wait to have two more daughters ... and more grandchildren!

Truth Withheld
