Exercising Liberty:

The Guiding Principles of Faith, Grace, Expediency and Edification

iberty is not an isolated or standalone doctrine. In this study we will take a look at four guiding principles that will assist the believer in exercising his individual liberty.

FAITH

The first principle that we will consider is the one of faith. Paul is clear that our walk before the Lord is to be one based on faith.

Faith is to be *personal*.

Let each one be fully assured in his own mind (Romans 14:5).

The faith which you have, have for yourself in God's sight. Happy is he who is not judging himself in that which he is attesting (Romans 14:22).

Faith is to be exercised without the dominion of men.

Not that we are lording it over your faith, but are fellow workers of your joy, for you stand fast in the faith (II Corinthians 1:24).

GRACE

God has called us to a life of grace, not law – a life that proceeds from the heart and love, not from externals.

For Sin shall not be lording it over you, for you are not under law, but under grace (Romans 6:14).

Who are you who are judging Another's domestic? To his own Master he is standing or falling. Now he will be made to stand, for the Lord is able to make him stand (Romans 14:4).

EXPEDIENCY

All is allowed me, but not all is expedient. All is allowed me, but not all is edifying.

Here in I Corinthians 10:23 Paul introduces to us two principles in this verse: expediency and edification.

The American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language defines expediency as "appropriate to a purpose."

Although all things were indeed lawful to Paul, he had the wisdom to realize that not all things were *appropriate* to the *purpose* he sought to accomplish. In other words, Paul lived *purposefully*. His actions were not mindless, but thoughtful "as to the Lord."

Then, whether you are eating or drinking, or (see Exercise, page 3623)

anything you are doing, do all for the glory of God (I Corinthians 10:31).

Our actions should be deliberate and with fore-thought. This is what the believer's life is intended to be – rather than a mindless spur-of-the-moment "going along" – so that *any* action can be done "heartily as to the Lord."

To this same end Paul exhorts the believer to a "reasonable," rather than mindless life:

... your **reasonable** service (Romans 12:1, KJV).

Other translations of this phrase are helpful to see the thoughtfulness to which Paul was encouraging the believer:

intelligent service (Young)

logical divine service (Concordant)

rational divine service (Rotherham)

God's will for our lives does not involve the *mindless* following of this world's course. Instead, our lives are to be "reasonable," "intelligent," "logical" and "rational" (i.e., well thought out, with purpose). The world's social, cultural, political, economic and religious courses will constantly pressure us to conform. Paul exhorts us not to give sway to this conformity ("not to be configured to this eon" – Romans 12:2).

According to Galatians 5:1, Christ freed the believer for the purpose of freedom! He freed us *to be free* – not to be entangled again into bondage. Christ did not die for *theoretical* liberty. He freed us to *experience* and *live* in freedom. Observe how various translations have rendered the first part of this glorious verse:

Christ has set us free in freedom; stand fast therefore (Darby).

For freedom did Christ set us free: stand fast therefore (American Standard).

It was for freedom that Christ has set us free; therefore keep standing firm (Common Edition).

For freedom Christ frees us! Stand firm, then (Concordant).

For freedom did Christ make us free; stand fast, therefore (Weymouth).

It is in this context of personal freedom that Paul then considers what is the most expedient course of action in the details of his life. It is also in this context of this personal freedom that Paul makes personal determinations as to the value of any activity "as to the Lord." Notice that he says, "All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient." Paul was making personal assessments as to what things were expedient, and what things were not.

The Greek word *sumphero*, rendered "*expedient*," carries the meaning of "profitable" and "beneficial," as can be seen in the following translations:

all are not profitable (Darby).

not all things are profitable (Rotherham).

not everything is profitable (Weymouth).

all things are not profitable (Young).

not all things are beneficial (Diaglott).

Although all things were lawful to Paul, not all things were profitable or beneficial. So it is with each of us. In our individual walk with the Lord we should not live mindlessly in our freedom, but thoughtfully and with purpose toward the end of expediency. This determination varies from situation to situation, and would also vary from person to person in their own fluctuating and unique circumstances.

One must be careful when dealing with others on this point, because, as we have already seen, underlying this principle is the clear issue of *personal* faith. Our view of expediency is then to be borne out of *personal* faith!

Tony Smith wonderfully describes this important principle:

Everything is permissible to me. So why should I take issue with a brother who decides that the ▶

thing that I find not to be beneficial to me is entirely beneficial to him? For freedom Christ freed us, so why should I condemn a brother who exercises his liberty?

EDIFICATION

Paul's second principle I Corinthians 10:23 is edification.

The word "edify" means to "build up" and is akin to the word "edifice." This also is the meaning of the Greek word oikodomeō. Thus many translations use the words "build up" in this passage (i.e., "not all things build up"). It has also been translated by some as "constructive" (i.e., "but not all things are constructive").

Though all things were lawful to Paul, he did not find that all things were constructive to the *purpose* which he sought to accomplish. In other words, Paul sought to live *constructively*. His actions of liberty and freedom were bold, but not mindless. They were thoughtful and with purpose, "as to the Lord," "for the use of edifying" (i.e., for the purpose of building up).

Paul actively and boldly taught the truth of the believer's liberty ("all things are lawful," "there is nothing unclean of itself") that had been revealed to him by our risen Lord Jesus Christ; to the end that the believer would not be brought "into bondage."

Paul knew full well that there were "false brothers" who would be "smuggled in," secretly to "spy out our freedom which we have in Christ Jesus, that they should be enslaving us." Paul, however, would,

Not even for an hour ... simulate by subjection,³ that the truth of the evangel should be continuing with you (Galatians 2:4).

The truth of the evangel is centered in the believer's liberty.

For freedom Christ frees us! Stand firm, then (Galatians 5:1).

3. "submit to them" (Weymouth).


Paul knew that there would be no edification ("Stand"!) without liberty and freedom. He would not deny this glorious truth, and he also knew that it was only the exercising of liberty *in love* that would ultimately build up. However, he also instructed us that,

Knowledge puffs up, yet love builds up (I Corinthians 8:1).

In fact, he revealed to us that the Body of Christ actually "edifies itself in love" (Ephesians 4:16), and that the use of such edification "ministers grace" (Ephesians 4:29).

So, edification is the divine process of escorting one to their freedom in Christ through the indispensable means of *faith*, *love* and *grace*. These are the powerfully *constructive* principles of *edification* that are brought to bear in the details of daily life.

Let us always remember that we are God's chosen vessels of up-building, rather than down-tearing. ■


I thank The Lord for your ministry and encouragement. It was awesome meeting you, your sons, Martin, Dan and the other believers in Birmingham. -GA

It is in the prison epistle of Paul to the Ephesians that we find the most absolute expression of the Deity of God in relation to the points we have been considering. Here we find the phrase which puts all other Scriptures into their perspective:

God is the captain of the ship of the universe; all of His creatures are its passengers. He is guiding the vessel across the ocean of time from the port that is called "All in God" to the haven that is termed "God in all."


