... transformed, from glory to glory (II Corinthians 3:18).

In the apostle's own words, his ministry goes *"from glory to glory"* (II Corinthians 3:18). Paul's ministry ... began in grace and gathered more grace and glory as it progressed. — A.E. Knoch

"The Hope of Israel"

According to Paul's own testimony, during his early ministry he had preached "*the hope of Israel.*" At the end of the period covered by the book of Acts he plainly declared,¹

... for *the hope of Israel* I am bound with *this chain* (Acts 28:20).

"None Other Things"

Therefore, during the Acts period, by Paul's own admission his ministry had been limited to what *"the prophets and Moses did say should come"*:

... witnessing both to small and great, saying **none other things**² than those which the prophets and Moses did say should come: that Christ should suffer, and that He should be the first that should rise from the dead, and should show light unto the People,³ and to the Gentiles⁴ (Acts 26:22).

4. *I.e.*, members of the nations.



"A Light to the Gentiles"

Therefore, during this period Paul's early ministry was to be a light *"to the Gentiles.*" Again, by Paul's own witness the Lord had told him,

I have set thee to be a light of the Gentiles (Acts 13:47).

Being a light to the Gentiles was a *prophetic* ministry under the auspices of Israel:⁵

I will also give thee for a light to the Gentiles (Isaiah 49:6).

"Acting as a Priest"

Paul identified this prophetic work as his *priestly* ministry:

5. This is not to be confused with how the Gentiles will, at a later time, be brought to God through the *rise* of national of Israel:

"Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee. For, behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people: but the LORD shall arise upon thee, and his glory shall be seen upon thee. And the Gentiles shall come to thy light, and kings to the brightness of thy rising" (Isaiah 60:1-3).

... for me to be the minister of Christ Jesus for the nations, acting as a priest⁶ of the evangel of God, that the approach present of the nations may be becoming well received, having been hallowed by holy spirit (Romans 15:16, Concordant Version).

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"Guests of the Covenants of Promise"

During Paul's early ministry the believing Gentiles were made guests of the promises covenanted to Israel:

... guests of the covenants of promise (Ephesians 2:12, Concordant Version).

"Minister of the New Covenant"

Thus, as a priest of God to the nations, Paul was a competent dispenser of Israel's New Covenant to them:

Who has also made us able ministers of the New Covenant (II Corinthians 3:6).7

"Grafted in Among Them"

Believing Gentiles of Paul's early ministry were grafted into the root and fatness of Israel:

You, being a wild olive tree, were grafted in among them, and with them partake of the root *and fatness of the olive tree* (Romans 11:17).

ISRAEL'S "SPIRITUAL THINGS"

These Gentiles were thus made partakers of Israel's "spiritual things":

the Gentiles have been made partakers of their spiritual things (Romans 15:27).8

"Abraham's Seed"

Thus, the Gentiles were brought in as spiritual seed of Abraham and heirs of Israel's promises:

If you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise (Galatians 3:29).

"Jerusalem ... the Mother of Us All"


Not only did Paul teach believing Gentiles during the Acts period that Abraham was their father, but he also taught them that Jerusalem was their mother:

Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all (Galatians 4:26).

ISRAEL'S PROPHETIC BLINDING

In the last chapter of the book of Acts Paul declares to Israel the final prophetic blinding foretold by Isaiah of their generation:

Hearing you will hear, and will not understand; and seeing you will see, and not perceive: for the heart

of this People has become dense, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes have they closed; lest they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them (:25-27).

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Paul then pronounces the decree, that now apart from Israel,

the salvation of God is sent unto the Gentiles (Acts 28:28).

A Secret Administration Revealed

The next time that we find Paul imprisoned, we do not see him bound for *"the hope of Israel,"* but by his own inspired testimony he was then shackled for a *"mystery"* (or *"secret"*):

... the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in bonds (Ephesians 6:19-20).

... the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in bonds (Colossians 4:3).

In Paul's latter ministry (after the Acts period) he wrote and ministered concerning a *New Secret Administration*, which he identified as "*the Administration of the Grace of God*" (Ephesians 3:2).

A New and Superior Hope

In God's present purpose today all of Israel's covenant and national advantages have been removed (Ephesians 2:14-15), and believers now can enjoy the "Administration" of the SECRET" (Ephesians 3:9), along with a new and superior hope, the Appearing of Christ in Glory:

When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory (Colossians 3:4).

Paul called this secret "appearing":

That Blessed Hope (Titus 2:13) *The Hope of Glory* (Colossians 1:27)

The Hope of His Calling (Ephesians 1:18) *His Appearing* (II Timothy 4:1, 8)

A.E. Knoch wrote concerning the timing of this grand transition of Paul *"from glory to glory"*:

Israel is not finally set aside until Paul is a prisoner in Rome. Isaiah's solemn message is sounded in their ears for the last time and the salvation of God is sent directly to the nations (Acts 28:28). Not until this crisis was it possible to reveal the last and crowning ministry of the great apostle. Hitherto blessing must be in some sort subordinate to Israel; but now they are out of the way, and grace is free to carry out the dictates of love.

So a secret is made known – *the secret of Christ* – which places Him upon the highest place in heaven, even as He shall be upon the earth. And this secret it is which underlies Paul's final ministry. It leaves earth for heaven. Jewish privileges disappear. The nations are not discriminated against in this supernal glory but are blessed equally with the chosen people in the heavenly spheres. ...

At last we find ourselves at the very zenith of revelation. This is found in Ephesians, Philippians and Colossians, epistles written after the apostle was imprisoned in Rome. They contain the truth of all truth for us. They are the touchstone of all doctrine for the present. They are the limit of glory beyond which there can be no more. ...

Paul's earlier ministries need modification to accord with the present truth.¹⁰





The Freedom to Excuse Ourselves

From a party-man, after a first and second admonition, excuse thyself (Titus 3:10, Rotherham Emphasized Version).

A "Party-man" is defined by Noah Webster as "a factious man"; faction being defined as "tumult, discord, dissension."

It certainly doesn't take long to realize that religion, Christianity included, is filled with endless contentions. It's bad enough that this world is so full of strife; but how sad it is when such is exercised in the name of God, and pawned off as spirituality.

Two decades ago, after many years of personal grief over such strife, Father graciously granted me sight of the higher road. I saw from the Scriptures that we are free to excuse ourselves from wrangling.

It really was quite a simple thing: it takes at least two to argue and fight. No one can effectively war all by themselves; so, as a decisive act of faith, I could respectfully refuse to be one of the two. I could meekly and graciously excuse myself from that which was a grief to Father's Spirit

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- the proclamation of the riches of God's abundant, exceeding grace (Romans 5:20; 11:6; Ephesians 1:7);
- the "preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery, which was kept secret in ages past" (Romans 16:25);

(Ephesians 4:30-32).

I learned that I could fellowship with anyone, but once divisiveness and contention arose, I simply could just excuse myself from the disruptive discord and thereby remain loyal to my high-calling.

I realized that I was under no obligation to respond to divisiveness, or enter into debate. Since it's hard for those with factious spirits to argue all by themselves, I could bring it to a close - at least as far as it related to my part. I didn't need to be party to the carnality of "party-men." I needn't be drawn into the likeness of their "folly" (Proverbs 26:4).

Dear precious ones, for the greater sake of "endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3), I implore us all simply to "excuse ourselves" (Titus 3:10) from that which is a dishonor to God and our calling of peace.

God has called us to peace (I Corinthians 7:15).

Let the peace of Christ be arbitrating in your hearts, for which you were called also in one body (Colossians 3:15).
