The Revelation of the mystery, which was kept secret since the world began (Romans 16:25).

Why It Is Called the Mystery

BECAUSE IT WAS KEPT SECRET

The Revelation of the mystery, which was kept se*cret since the world began.* (Romans 16:25).

BECAUSE IT WAS HIDDEN IN GOD

The mystery, which from the beginning of the world *hath been hid in God* (Ephesians 3:9).

BECAUSE IT WAS HIDDEN FROM AGES AND GENERATIONS

Even the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations (Colossians 1:26).

Which in other ages was not made known unto the sons of men (Ephesians 3:5).

Here are three Biblical reasons why this revelation is called a "mystery." It was kept secret, hidden in God, and hidden from ages and generations.

The word "mystery" means "secret," and as used in the Bible it means a "sacred secret."

Since it was kept secret, hidden in God, this mystery cannot be found in the Old Testament.

A phrase in Ephesians 3:8, "the unsearchable riches of Christ," also testifies to this fact. "Unsearchable" means "untraceable" - that is, these riches of Christ cannot be traced anywhere else in the Bible except in Paul's writings, which are specifically [directed] to the Body of Christ.

In addition to the three verses already quoted, "the Mystery" is mentioned at least six other times.

Having made known unto us the mystery of His will (Ephesians 1:9).

He made known unto me **the mystery** (Ephesians 3:3).

That ye may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ (Ephesians 3:4).

To make known the mystery of the gospel (Ephesians 6:19).

To speak **the mystery** of Christ, for which I am also in bonds (Colossians 4:3).

Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience (I Timothy 3:9).

This makes, then, "the Mystery" a unique and distinctive message; it is a message that is absolutely different from anything that was preached before it and from anything that will be preached after it.

"The Revelation of the Mystery" is in a class by itself, and certainly it is not to be mixed with any other Gospel or thought to be part of any other Gospel.

Stay the Course

hen you run a marathon – a 26.2 mile race – you always wonder – usually somewhere after the 20-mile mark – why the hell you decided to run a marathon. It seemed like such a good idea a couple months before, while dreaming of the glory of crossing the finish line during an easy training run.

Then comes the race. It's fun at first (I have run five marathons). The excitement of running with great gobs of people and drinking as many free cups of Gatorade as you can choke down, makes you glad you entered. But then comes the 20-mile mark. As the waffles at the bottoms of your shoes melt into the pavement, you question your sanity. And how can there be so many other stupid idiots in one place, doing the same stupid thing?

While suffering, it is easy to talk yourself off the course. When your legs start cramping and you can't slake your thirst anymore, you must trust that you had good reasons for being here. You can't think of one of them now – it's true – but you know you had at least a couple. Thus, the marathon now becomes a run of faith. You already made the decision – now keep going. Try to remember the days when you had weighed this out, and decided to do it.

None of us decided to be born. But we did decide to get married. To have kids. To take that job. To buy the car. To start the exercise program. *To follow Christ no matter what*. I have heard so many of you say, "I can't turn back now. How can I go back?" I hate to say this but, relatively speaking, you *can* go back. You *can* quit the fight. I know that's a scary thought, but it's real. This happened with some of Paul's closest companions.

Demas, loving this current eon, forsook me (II Timothy 4:10).

Incredibly, it happened with all of the ecclesias of Asia:

All those in the province of Asia were turned from me (II Timothy 1:15).

They were turned, not just from Paul, but from his message.

We cannot lose membership in the body of Christ. But we *can* – by walking off the course – lose rewards at the dais of Christ given to those who endure (II Timothy 2:12).

This is a marathon, folks, and it ain't over 'til it's over.

n article about an upcoming "positive" and "inspirational" show on the USA network, featuring Kurt Warner states the following (quoted from The Blaze):

As for his own life, Warner said that he has seen God work in mysterious ways.

"My life's an example of what can be done when you mix your belief in work, effort and God's grace and power," he said.

Despite the personal shortcomings that every individual has, Warner believes God can help transform life situations. But he also cautions that people must be willing to examine their own hearts — and minds — to stay motivated. Rather than avoiding challenges, the host said it's important for people to walk through whatever doors God might open.

"A big part of what I've learned is that God can do amazing things wherever our shortcomings or limitations are," he said. "God's there to step in and do more with me than anyone expected. If you stay focused on what God presents in front of you ... stay prepared ...

whatever you do, be great at it."

While at first glance it seems "positive" and "inspirational," Kurt Warner's statement is a sad reflection on the "Christian" belief system's faulty reasoning, as if anything that God "somehow" "manages" to get done can be done only when your own personal belief, motivation and effort are enough for Him to "step in" and assist you in accomplishing your dream (read, "will").

This is just human philosophy at best, dressed in the guise of "spiritual" language that makes it appear godly. Yet it is anything but, when we consider the Bible's many statements that ALL is of God (i.e., II Corinthians 5:18), and the numerous passages that His will is done in spite of and contrary to what man may think, say or do. Let one passage suffice to proclaim that God is God, and that nothing that we think, say or do will alter His plan and purpose through all of the ages – past, present or future:

He doeth according to His will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth; and none can stay His hand, or say unto Him, "What doest Thou?" (Daniel 4:35).

And the High Calling of God in Christ Jesus

When did nationalism begin? What is God's purpose for nationalism? Is the United States a Christian nation? Does any government have *Favored Nation Status* with God today? Should believers support Israel? What did Paul have to say about our citizenship? What is our role in relation to nations? Is our job to rid the world of evil?
