The Secret of Casting Joy

by — F.W. Davis (1879-1926)

Rejoice in the Lord (Philippians 3:1, 5).

he word "rejoice" occurs eight times in the epistle to the Philippians, but on one of those occurrences the word in the original is different from the rest.

The frequent use of this word is noticeable because this is one of the "Prison Epistles." No prison doors were flung open for Paul at Rome, as had been the case when he and Silas were imprisoned in Philippi (Acts 16:12, 27), yet he was rejoicing even more than when he was at liberty. It was during this imprisonment that he made known, by writing, those great truths about the Church, the Body of Christ. Never before had such teaching been divulged (Ephesians 3:5).

One hardly expects to receive letters from men in prison on the subject of rejoicing! Yet he was not only telling those to whom he wrote to rejoice, but he himself rejoiced in his imprisonment! It is paradoxical that a man in prison, facing all sorts of difficulties, should say again and again "rejoice," yet this word is almost the keynote of the letter.

He rejoiced at those things which bring joy² to or-

dinary people in the ordinary way; but the unusual thing is that he rejoiced at whatever came along. If he were to be set at liberty he would rejoice; if he were to be put to death he would still rejoice; if he were free from suffering he rejoiced, if not, he insists on rejoicing just the same!

The question which naturally arises is, "What is the secret?" Few are like that today. The reason is not that we have not as big a revelation; we have. Neither is it that Paul had a bigger Savior, nor that God was any greater then than now. The values of the cross³ were no greater, nor was the Sovereignty of God more

mighty. Obviously all of these facts were much greater to Paul than they are to us, but in themselves they were exactly the same. He knew them as few do today, and then, as ever, those who know their God do exploits. The reason why men do not put their trust in God is because they don't KNOW HIM. It is not necessary for us to admit how imperfectly we know Him - our actions reveal our ignorance to intelligent observers.

It was stated above that once when "rejoice" occurs in this epistle, the word in the Greek differs from that used on other occasions. This is in 3:3, where our version would read more clearly

We ... boast in Christ Jesus.

Now that very expression "Christ Jesus," when grasped, takes us out of Earth and puts us into Heaven! In Christ Jesus there is everything we need perfectly to present us before God. Some believe there is something of human merit that will fit them for God's presence. Let us boast in Christ's merits. If there is any boasting in God's presence it must be in "Christ Jesus." You may find out again and again how unfit you are for Heaven, yet you can boast "in Christ Jesus." Paul came to the end of everything that he thought would satisfy God for his standing, he let it all go (Philippians 3:8-9). He boasted "in Christ Jesus," had no confidence in the flesh, no confidence in anything he could do that would give him a standing4 in God's presence. Resting fully on God's Christ,

we can begin to boast, because we boast in ONE Who never varies by a hair's breadth.

In our text the ordinary word is used for "rejoice," and in the three words which immediately follow that the secret of perpetual joy is found. Note it does not say here rejoice in "Christ Jesus." No, here He is "Lord." This is where we learn the secret of lasting joy; for it is in our relationship to Him, in that character, that we shall alone be able to rejoice at all times.

In I Corinthians 12:3 we read that no man can say Jesus is "Lord" but by God's Spirit. Paul uses this title⁵ here in our text. Any man can say it, of course; you can teach infants in the Sunday School to say it: just mere utterance is not what is meant at all.

Can he say He is "Jesus"? Yes! Any man of ordinary intellect knows that a man of the name of Jesus once lived

and died, and different values are attached to His death. You can learn that, as a fact of history, but no man can say "Jesus is Lord" but by spiritual life and spiritual power. That makes all the difference. To give Him that place of pre-eminence, not only on Earth but in Heaven, in life, in thought, in business or pleasure, to acknowledge Him "Lord." The relationship is that of the owner to the slave: obedience, submission, dependence, nothing without Him. Paul does not say "rejoice in Jesus."

These things are important. Have you learned the secret of taking everything from Him day by day?⁶ One of the human characteristics is grumbling about conditions, growling about circumstances, complaining about this and that. "Rejoice evermore," says the Apostle. "Rejoice in the Lord alway, and again I say rejoice!"

Like the Lord Jesus you may be passing through the hands of men, yet you must recognize like Him that "Thou couldst have no power against me except it were given" thee." He recognized the Lordship of His Father

then, and as we recognize His Lordship we rejoice.

When opposing things come the believer's way, he should say, "What has this to teach me? Something very interesting, something I cannot learn in any other way. It has come in love."

God could not send anything to any of His tested children in any other character but love – love which we cannot understand. Confidently I have to rejoice in it, because there is good in it. If only I can take it from the hand of my Lord it is full of comfort, of fruit, and blessing, for time and the ages. Some call Him "Savior" and trust Him as Savior, but many of them do not know Him as "Lord." The Lord asks and seeks to be trusted, not as a Helper to Whom you go and say, "I want you to do this or that, or the other," but One Who comes into your lives before ever you think, and plans and arranges for you, and with Him you have fellowship, and recognize Him as Lord. As long as you are quarrelling with His arrangement for your life, you will never have peace and never know the secret of joy.

Elsewhere, in one of the best known passages in the whole of the Divine Library, this is illustrated for us:

Take My yoke upon you ... and you shall find rest ... (Matthew 11:28-30).

He has an undisputed right to govern me and mine. If we are questioning the way that He is leading, then we soon get "sore neck," for the yoke chafes; but if we "take" it as He took His Father's yoke when He said, "Even so Father, for so it seemed good in Thy sight," then we shall find rest to our souls.



versions is simply a stake and not the concept conveyed in religious artwork. "Never meaning 'cross,'" it was "straight" and "uncrossed." "One should not add to the biblical stake an additional piece of wood, because a cross obscures the biblical symbolism" (F.H. Baader, *Dabhar Concept Explanations*).

Stake of Christ

he stake is foreshadowed in the admonishing sign in the wilderness (Numbers 21:8-9) and in the staff of Aaron which became a serpent and, as a monster, swallowed up all of the monsterstaffs of the "experts in signs" of Egypt (Exodus 7:10-12). The Death-swallower, Christ, shows Himself in connection to a straight, uncrossed staff. The foreshadowing picture is a staff-serpent, not a cross-serpent. Also Isaiah 22:22-23 (peg) confirms, besides other testimonies in the Word of God, that the wood on which our Lord died was not a cross1 but a stake. The sign of leading through the sea of bulrush (the Red Sea), and therefore the sign of rescue from the pursuing enemy, is a pillar of cloud and fire; it is Christ, fire-baptized on the stake. One should not add to the biblical Stake an additional piece of wood, because a cross obscures the biblical symbolism.

he Greek word Paul used for "kindly affectionate" is Φιλόστοργος (philostorgos), a word meaning "affectionate regard of members of a family," "cherishing one's kindred."

As believers, Paul tells us that we are bound by family ties. These are not, however, bonds of genealogy, but rather spiritual bonds of a far higher household – "the family of faith" (Galatians 6:10).

The root of our English word "kindly" is of course kind. What may be interesting to note is that it was originally "kinned."

A "kind" person is a "kinned" person, one of kin; one who acknowledges and acts upon his kinship. — Dr. Richard Chenevix Trench, *On the Study of Words* (1859), page 53



The sport of chance⁸ has nothing to do with the believer's life. So often we put this down to chance and are thereby robbed of the assurance that *He* is ordering our steps as well as our circumstances, and then we miss this secret of rejoicing in the Lord.

In Luke 10:21, still another word is used in the original for "rejoice," but the idea is the same. In the face of difficulties and opposition, the Lord Jesus "rejoiced in spirit." That surely is perfect faith, when all seems wrong and we still hold on to the certainty that all is right, because it is right in God's eyes.

Someone asks, "Has the ordinary believer any right to use language such as Christ Himself used?" We answer, "You have no right to use any other language: everything else is unbelief. He did not take you up just to save you at the last, but to perform all things for you from the start to the finish."

Which perspective,9 then, have you got? Do you look at
